Completion of the New Boys' Dormitory

We are thankful that the boys' dorm has been completed, and the boys could move into the building in May. When we look back, we are so amazed at how God helped throughout this project. If we look at ourselves, there is no way this could have been completed.

The need for a boys' dorm arose when the school expanded to accept students from the surrounding area, rather than only from the children's home. Many of these students would walk for many kilometers to attend Sekolah Kristen Rehobot, and so they would stay at the children's home during their studies. The bedrooms in the home got quite crowded and so plans to build a new dorm were made.

The construction began at the beginning of 2024. Local builders and labourers were hired to do the work. There were not enough funds available to complete the project and so it was halted mid-2024. Funds to finish the project were raised in the fall of 2024 when Christina and Yanrus visited Canada and the Netherlands to make several presentations about the work they are involved with in Sumba.

The dorm is set up as one large room with beds, desks and cupboards on both sides of the hallway. There are 8 bathrooms as well as 40 bunk beds which can provide a sleeping space for 80 boys. A cistern was built beneath the building to collect rainwater during the rainy season. This water is used for the toilets and showers.

Quick Facts about the school

The school is divided into three parts: Preschool, Elementary and Middle School.

School starts at 7:00 a.m. sharp with standing at attention in front of the school to sing the national anthem.

Monday mornings there is an opening assembly which involves all the staff and students and on Saturday morning there is a school closing.



The school enrollment has grown to nearly 300 students this year from kindergarten to Grade 9.

On the first day of the new semester this year, the parents came to the school together with the students. The parents and the students planted trees around the school. This year they planted tropical fruit trees such as avocado, papaya and mango. We

have been planting trees around the school for several years, but this year we also planted trees around the four churches in our community.

The students are responsible to water the trees, but in previous years many died during the dry season. We hope that these will continue to grow.

Meet Susanna

Susanna is a student at Rehoboth Christian School and has lived at the Pengharapan home since she was a baby.

Q: How old are you and what grade are you in at school?

A: I am 14 years old and am now in grade 9. I will soon graduate from junior high school.

Q: What is your favourite school subject?

A: My favourite subject is English and I like sports as well.

Q: What are some things you enjoy doing in your spare time?

A: I love to read a book in my free time, play volleyball or sometimes just play together with the girls.

Q: What chores are you responsible for around the home?

A: I help to clean the house and water the plants.

Q: What is your favourite food?

A: Chocolate!

Q: Tell us about one of your best memories.

A: My favourite memory is when I was able to have my own Bible and my own story book. I have lots of good memories in the home; my family is here in the Pengharapan home.





In June the government made the decision about the extra buildings that they promised us. They approved the plan, and the Lord willing, we hope the buildings will be completed in December, the Lord willing.

We do not currently have enough classrooms for junior high school, so for now we use the main hall as classrooms. We have divided it into three classrooms. We have to make extra tables and buy chairs.

The government is funding a science laboratory, library, office, school clinic and restroom. For this project, our government gives us the funds

(according to the budget that we proposed) and we manage the building project ourselves. We submit all the accounting and report weekly; it is a lot of paperwork!

When these buildings are ready, we hope we can use the library, science laboratory and the office as classrooms. We are very thankful because these buildings come at the right time. For the time being we are doing our school opening devotions in the school yard, when it's too hot we move under the trees. It reminds us about how we held our Sunday school classes so many years ago.

In order to transport building materials to the school addition site we needed to purchase a truck (single axle dump truck). We are hoping to purchase large water tanks that can be installed on the back of the to bring water TanaMBanas during the dry season. Our goal is to raise \$40,000 to pay back the truck loan as quickly as possible. If you are able to help us with this, we would be grateful.

Above all, we thank God for His grace to us, we really can feel that He is always leading us and never leaves us. May God give us wisdom and heart full of love to teach these children.

Prayer Requests

Pray that the Lord will bless the work in the home, school and mission posts.

Thanksgiving for a plentiful rainy season. Pray that there will be enough food for the people around TanaMBanans.

Pray for sufficient staff for the children's home and the school; that new staff may be found to replace those who have moved away.

Pray for Idi, a staff member who has been at the mission for 24 years, whose husband recently passed away suddenly.

Pray that the junior high school addition may go smoothly and that those doing the work would be kept in safety.


